What are the possible outcomes (positive and challenging) of a ministry- approach that honors a higher leadership role for the pastor in an Anabaptist/Pietistic church system?

Marks of Transformational Leadership

Effective pastoral leadership aims at life-change (individually & corporately) in and through Jesus Christ. But for life-change to occur, church systems must change, in order to provide supportive environments for transformation. Questions to be addressed are: What is the role of vision in a local church? How does my church develop a thought-through, life-changing vision; does everyone need to buy in? Overall: how does the church/leader develop a church environment that allows life-change to happen? How does structural change contribute to a life-changing environment; when is structural change most advisable and fruitful? What does a leader do when “the going gets tough”?
