I want to thank church board/leadership team chairpersons and congregations as well as individuals who have responded so generously to my and the district's appeal letter of April 6 to provide financial and prayer support toward the district's commitment to build a Habitat for Humanity house. As of my letter on April 6, we had \$12,735 of the \$21,667 necessary to begin digging the foundation. (Sponsors need to have at least one-third of the sponsorship cost of \$65,000 on hand in order to begin digging the foundation.) Over the past month, \$6,182 has come in, making our total funds on-hand \$18,917.45, leaving us just \$2,750 short of being able to start digging! So far, twelve congregations have contributed to the effort, with six individuals also making generous gifts. Thank you, and please keep this ministry in your checkbook and prayers.

District Standing Committee representative Jim Benedict has scheduled three briefings about the upcoming June 29 - July 3 Greensboro, NC Annual Conference. The briefings will be at Denton on Saturday, June 4 from 10-noon; Broadfording on Sunday, June 12 from 2-4 p.m.; and Oakton on Saturday, June 18 from 10-noon. You are welcome to attend any of the briefings. Jim Benedict will be leading the meetings. Additionally, this year's Moderator, Andy Murray, will be in New Windsor on May 24, and that evening the Brethren Service Center's Zigler Hospitality Center is offering a Meet and Greet Dinner with the Moderator. Andy will share highlights and an overview of the upcoming conference. Social time is 5:30 with dinner at 6. Cost of the meal is \$10.00/person, and reservations can be made by calling 410-635-8700, or by emailing mgrossnickle@brethren.org.
