#### FIRST EVENT OF THE SCHOOL YEAR

(don't forget the incoming freshmen) ...

Plan now to attend the M.A.D. Youth Beach Retreat
Cape Henlopen State Park in Lewes, Delaware
September 9-11, 2016

Who? - Senior high youth, classes 2016 (this year's grads) thru 2020 (incoming freshmen) and their advisors - ratio recommended per church is 1 "mature" advisor/chaperone, age 22 or older, per 6 youth.

Cost - \$50 if you register by August 5; \$55 by Aug 20; \$60 by Sept 2. You arrange your own transportation (preferably as a church group). Our money will not be refunded in the event that a hurricane closes down the park (their rules). Our plan, barring a hurricane, is to go ahead with the retreat, rain or shine.

**Accommodations** - barracks style housing, with 15 beds per room. Each person should bring their own linens or sleeping bag, as well as beach "things" (modesty, please). The facility is within walking distance of the beach on the ocean side, and the pier on the Bay side. There are many hiking and biking trails within the park. A kitchen is provided, but no cook, so we will prepare the menu and be our own cooks.

Arrival - Friday evening after 8 pm or Saturday morning by 9 am - the price would remain the same. Please tell us in advance if you are not planning on arriving until Saturday morning. Check-out time from the housing area is 11 am on Sunday, but you are free to stay in the park. Parking in the youth camp area is limited and we are allowed 1 parking pass per 4 people. Advisors, please indicate on the top of your registration form how many vehicle passes you will need for your group... carpool as much as possible to ensure we have enough passes.

**Program** - Leadership is still being discussed for this weekend. We'll have a worship service, as well as vespers/devotion times each day. There will be plenty of free time to enjoy the ocean, beach, trails, and other recreation possibilities within the park - without leaving it for the duration of the retreat. More details will be on MAD Youth facebook page as they become available. Feel free to ask us questions or many

suggestions.

42 Henlopen Drive, Lewes, DE 19958

Rt 50 East, across the Bay Bridge (for those coming from the West), to Rt 404 East toward Denton. Continue on Rt 404 into Delaware towards Bridgeville/Georgetown/Lewes. (Rt. 404 joins Rt 18 East towards Georgetown after Bridgeville.) From Georgetown, stay on Rt. 404/Rt 9 toward Lewes to Cape Henlopen State Park entrance (you'll cross over Rt. 1). Park entrance is just past the Ferry. Follow signs to the Youth camp area (you can get turn-by-turn directions on the www.madyouth.org webpage.


# 46th Annual Dunker Church Service Antietam National Battlefield, Sharpsburg Maryland Sunday, September 18, 2016 3:00 pm

# Tour the Holy Land

With Tour Hosts Pastor Bob Krouse and Pastor Daniel <u>D'Oleo</u>

8 days from only \$2,848 • November 28, 2016

Day 1 - NEW YORK - Depart from a New York area gateway to Ben Gurion Airport in Tel Aviv. Dinner and breakfast are served on board.

DAY 2 - GALILEE - Upon arrival at the Tel Aviv airport, we transfer to our hotel in the Galilee for dinner and overnight. Already we begin to feel the spirit of this land enchanting us, as we will be visiting sites from the Bible and share the experience of walking in the footsteps of Jesus. (D)

DAY 3 - GALILEE - This morning we take a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee to Ginnos ar where we will visit the fishermen's boat found here dating back to Jesus' time. We continue to the Mount of Beatitudes, site of the Sermon on the Mount. On to Tabgha, site of the Miracle of the Loaves and Fishes and to Capernaum, the center of the Lord's early ministry. Drive along the lower Galilee mountains to Cana, site of the wedding feast. We continue on to Nazareth to visit the Church of Annunciation and Mary's Well, Onto Tiberias for dinner and overnight, (B.D)

DAY 4 - JERUSALEM - This morning we drive along the Sea of Galilee to arrive at Yardenit, the Baptismal Center on the Jordan River. From here we drive to Mount Carmel to visit the Carmelite Monastery at Muhkraka, the location of Elijah's altar. We continue via the Valley of Armageddon to the excavation of Tel Megiddo. Drive along the Mediterranean coast to Caesarea to visit the Roman theater and aqueduct. Ascend the Judean Hills to the Holy City of Jerusalem in time for dinner and overnight. (B,D)

DAY 5 - JERUSALEM - Departing Jerusalem we drive past the inn of the "Good Samaritan" and continue to the shores of the Dead Sea - the lowest point on earth. We travel along the shore to Mas ada, the fortress where the Jewish Zealots held off the armies of the Roman Empire before choosing suicide over surrender. Continue to Ein Gedi, where King David found shelter from the wrath of King Saul. After lunch, we can enjoy a short "float" on the Dead Sea. Continue to Qumran where in 1947 the Dead Sea Scrolls were discovered in a cave. Afterwards we return to Jerusalem. (B,D)

DAY 6 - JERUSALEM - We start the day with a visit to the Garden Tomb, followed by an orientation beside Calvary. Travel to the Old City, through St. Stephen's Gate to the Pool of Bethesda, the Chapel of the Flagellation, and the Ecce Homo Arch. View the Gabbatha pavement before proceeding to the Temple area and Mt. Moriah to visit the Western Wall, the Ophel archaeological park, where we see the Pinnacle and the visitors' center dedicated to research of the Biblical Temple. Continue through the Bazaar to the last stations of the Via Dolorosa. In the afternoon we drive to Bethlehem to visit the Church of the Nativity, the Milk Grotto and the cave of St. Jerome. (B,D)

DAY 7 - JERUSALEM - Drive to Mount Scopus to view the impressive home of the Hebrew University before continuing to the Mount of Olives for an outstanding view of Jerusalem. Visit the Chapel of the Ascension, Garden of Gethsemane, and Church of All Nations. See the Kidron Valley and Tomb of Absalom, Zechariah and James. We continue to Mount Zion, the Room of the Last Supper, and King David's Tomb, and past the Knesset and the Israel Museum. Next visit the recently constructed Model of Ancient Jerusalem. Time permitting, visit the recently excavated archaeological site in the Jewish quarter- the Cardo, the "Wide" wall built by King Hezekiah and the Herodian mansion. Enjoy a farewell dinner before being transferred to the airport. (B,D)

DAY 8 - NEW YORK - Depart Tel Aviv for your flight back to the United States. Arrive New York with wonderful memories of your tour of the Holy Land.


