

Who? - Senior high youth, classes 2016 (this year's grads) thru 2020 (incoming freshmen) and their advisors - ratio recommended per church is 1 "mature" advisor/chaperone, age 22 or older, per 6 youth.

**Cost** - \$50 if you register by August 5; \$55 by Aug 20; \$60 by Sept 2. You arrange your own transportation (preferably as a church group). Our money will <u>not</u> be refunded in the event that a hurricane closes down the park (their rules). Our plan, barring a hurricane, is to go ahead with the retreat, rain or shine.

**Accommodations** - barracks style housing, with 15 beds per room. Each person should bring their own linens or sleeping bag, as well as beach "things" (modesty, please). The facility is within walking distance of the beach on the ocean side, and the pier on the Bay side. There are many hiking and biking trails within the park. A kitchen is provided, but no cook, so we will prepare the menu and be our own cooks.

*Arrival* - Friday evening after 8 pm or Saturday morning by 9 am - the price would remain the same. Please tell us in advance if you are not planning on arriving until Saturday morning. Check-out time from the housing area is 11 am on Sunday, but you are free to stay in the park. Parking in the youth camp area is limited and we are allowed 1 parking pass per 4 people. <u>Advisors, please indicate on the top of your registration form how many vehicle passes you will need for your group... carpool as much as possible to ensure we have enough passes.</u>

**Program** - Leadership is still being discussed for this weekend. We'll have a worship service, as well as vespers/devotion times each day. There will be plenty of free time to enjoy the ocean, beach, trails, and other recreation possibilities within the park - *without leaving it* for the duration of the retreat. More details will be on MAD Youth facebook page as they become available. Feel free to ask us questions.

#### Directions to Cape Henlopen State Park:

42 Henlopen Drive, Lewes, DE 19958

Rt 50 East, across the Bay Bridge (for those coming from the West), to Rt 404 East toward Denton. Continue on Rt 404 into Delaware towards Bridgeville/Georgetown/Lewes. (Rt. 404 joins Rt 18 East towards Georgetown after Bridgeville.) From Georgetown, stay on Rt. 404/Rt 9 toward Lewes to Cape Henlopen State Park entrance (you'll cross over Rt. 1). Park entrance is just past the Ferry. Follow signs to the Youth camp area (you can get turn-by-turn directions on the www.madyouth.org webpage.



Alternate directions (smaller road, but much less

Traffic): From Rt. 404, after you get through Denton, turn left onto Rt. 16 East. Follow Rt. 16 all the way to Rt 1 South. Turn right onto Rt. 1 South and follow to Rt. 9 (look for the Cape Henlopen State Park and Lewes-Cape May Ferry signs.



#### Clergy Sacred Listening Circle (Group Spiritual Direction) 2016-2017

**Growing spiritually** is something we sometimes take for granted in the church. Many assume that Christian ministers will come closer to God by the work they do in the church (learning by osmosis). But this is only part the story. Developing a deep relationship with "the Ground of our Being" takes daily prayer practices and a willingness to share in a safe and confidential way with others traveling the same road. Listening carefully for the divine whisper and speaking what is on our hearts can open us to new insights when done in a prayerful way.

**Shepherd's Spring Outdoor Ministry Center** is offering a small group experience in spiritual companionship, specifically for those in set-apart Christian ministry. Sacred Listening Circles is a monthly gathering for prayer, faith-sharing, and listening to the Spirit. The group starts in early October and concludes in early May, meeting in the Oasis Room in the Lodge. Shepherd's Spring is located at 16869 Taylors Landing Road, Sharpsburg, MD. This is an ecumenical experience, open to all denominations and faith backgrounds.

**Leadership.** The group leader is Rev. Ed Poling. Ed is a minister in the Church of the Brethren, having served congregations in Hagerstown, Carlisle (PA), Waynesboro (PA) and Myersville. He has been trained as a spiritual director and retreat leader by the Shalem Institute for Spiritual Formation (Washington, DC), and Oasis Ministries for Spiritual Formation (Camp Hill, PA). Ed has been leading Sacred Listening Circles every year over the last two decades and been providing individual spiritual direction as well.

What is Needed to Participate. Three conditions are essential to the life of the group. All participants must be willing to—

- commit themselves to an honest relationship with God;
- attend the meetings regularly; and
- enter into the group process through prayerful listening and response, opening their journeys for reflection with others.

**Costs. \$125.00** Participants will also need to purchase a copy of the reading book.


**Readings.** Each participant is asked to read a book on the spiritual life. This year's book is *Immortal Diamond: The Search for our True Selves* by Richard Rohr. A chapter will be assigned for each meeting.

**Introductory/Orientation Meeting.** A special meeting will be held at Shepherd's Spring on Monday, September 12 at 10:00 am to meet with Ed and learn more about sacred listening circles.
