

Together on the Journey with your District Executive Minister......

From Thanksgiving until now I've been dealing with a health challenge. While tempted to feel depressed and angry, the silver lining is that I'm taking it as a wakeup call to make some significant life style changes. We're in Advent, a season which reminds us of the importance of preparation and patience.

My problem was diverticulitis with a perforation, which hospitalized me for four days with intense pain and on the verge of undergoing emergency surgery, which thankfully was averted. I'm still recovering. I have no doubt that being on the road through too many meal times, late night eating and unhealthy ways of coping with stress contributed to my problem. I'm committed to making changes for the healthier, but how much better it would have been to have addressed this a long time ago, and prepared for a healthier future. The twisted adage, "Never do today what you can put off until tomorrow" is an unhealthy way to live. I'm wondering if many of us in this season of preparation need to take more seriously that "our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit" (1 Cor 6:19), which among all the things that may mean, at the least means that we need to take better care of ourselves.

Preparation and patience go together. Through my recovery I'm being reminded of the virtue of patience. I'm a little better each day, the emphasis on *a little*. I'm often reminded of a throwaway comment a past professor of mine made to our class which was questioning him because we felt exams hadn't been promptly returned. He said, "Isn't patience the mark of a mature person?" That was a transformative remark that has inspired me over the years to be more patient, not that I'm not still learning patience, but I try to embrace opportunities to exercise patience and become more mature. Patience gives time and space for growth and good things to be manifest; impatience stifles and aborts that.

So I pray you an Advent that deepens your commitment to preparation along with exercises in patience. I'm not in a rush to get to Christmas. I'm content to wait here in Advent, to give time and attention to the good things that God would bring to life in us and for us, as we prepare and be patient.
