In this edition of the newsletter, we are excited to share with you what God is doing in and through Brother Yakubu Bakfwash, the restart pastor in Dundalk, Maryland. Yakubu and his family moved to Dundalk on December 12, 2016. In the seven weeks following their arrival, a lot has happened – a lot of meaningful, great things have taken place.

In the seven weeks following their arrival, Yakubu and his wife, Diana, have made several connections, have developed relationships with people in the community, and have knocked on several hundred doors. Together, they have been able to break down racial, class, and ethnic barriers to bring the gospel, the good news of Christ's salvation, to their community.

The secret of those seven weeks' hinges on personal and corporate prayer, trusting in God, and the leading of the Holy Spirit, which has resulted in the birth of a new church. A brand-new church – GraceWay Church of the Brethren – came into existence at 10:00 am on February 5. That day there were seven nations represented in worship: Ethiopians, Sudanese, Eritreans, Nigerians, American, Cameroonians, and the Congolese. A good picture of Revelation 7:9.

Since the doors of GraceWay Church were opened, there has been an average of twenty-five worshippers every other Sunday. These twenty-five had not worshipped in any Church of the Brethren before.

The new church is a multi-ethnic faith community of ordinary people in the hands of God, seeking to live out the Gospel. GraceWay is committed to God's good news for the salvation of the nations (that is, people of every ethnicity and language)

through evangelism, peacemaking, and reconciliation.

GraceWay Church will be a "GOING" church for a coming Christ. The gathering of different ethnicities in the worship of the one true God at the 10:00 am service has defined our identity in Christ. The establishment of GraceWay Church helps in the fulfilment for God's will to be done here "on earth as it is in heaven" (Matt 6:10).

Many opportunities are already opening up for ministry through the International Rescue Committee (IRC) of Baltimore, where Yakubu will help refugees settled in Dundalk adjust to the new culture in America. He will help the refugees with cross-cultural communication and learn how to navigate the new American culture. He sees this opportunity as an open door for evangelism.

Yakubu is excited to be a mentor to the new families that are being settled in Dundalk. Working as a mentor with IRC is a great opportunity that will help add value to God's kingdom. GraceWay Church is about "Equipping the nations to live transformed lives, so they can carry on the mission of Jesus."

The directional goal for GraceWay Church lies in its mission statement: "To Know Christ and to Make Him Known to the Nations" (Eph. 1:17-18; John 17:3; Rev. 7:9). The vision and the mission statements tell why the GraceWay Church congregation exists.
