Together on the Journey

A few thoughts on the journey...

I was encouraged by the outcome of this year's Annual Conference. I felt like the delegates' adoption of the denominational leadership team's and CODE's (Council of District Executives) recommendation to last year's West Marva query about how to respond to ministers and congregations that might conduct or condone same sex marriages, that any such situations be addressed by district ministry commissions (in Mid-Atlantic, that's our Calling and Credentialing Ministry Team) and leadership teams, informed by denominational and annual conference polity, was

the best we can do at present. I feel that the decision to retain On Earth Peace (OEP) as a denominational agency was important, although there is healing that needs to be facilitated between OEP and members and congregations around the Church of the Brethren, including the way the agency relates to membership. While 57% of delegates voted to terminate OEP's agency status, the vote did not achieve the 66% that would have been required to do so. I was also encouraged by what I sense to be a new spirit of hopefulness and optimism about the future of the Church of the Brethren that seems to be present with David Steele's tenure as General Secretary.

Here in the district there seems to be a growing interest in, energy for, and commitment to church planting and renewal. CEEMT (Church Extension and Evangelism Ministry Team) has been meeting regularly to facilitate planning and support for planting and congregational revitalization. The Dundalk-GraceWay restart is growing with the leadership of restart pastor Brother Yakubu Bakfwash. Individuals and congregations are committing to support through prayer, presence, and finances.

Our district leadership team had a good and productive meeting on August 5 and is looking ahead to doing some long-range planning at its December 2 meeting. Our Program and Arrangements (P&A) team continues to plan what promises to be an inspiring and encouraging district conference. District Moderator Brian Bachman has highlighted some of those plans in his lead article of this newsletter and recently sent a more detailed letter to all of our congregations and pastors. While there is no apparent earthshattering business on this year's agenda, there will be workshops to resource and strengthen congregations and persons, and it seems to me that in this time of increasing political and church polarization, it is especially important to be, pray, and worship God together. We will do that on October 13 and 14 in Frederick. Look forward to seeing you there, and on the journey.

Anyone 18 years of age or over is welcome to attend this 2-day training (27 hours) and become a certified CDS caregiver. References and background checks are also required for certification. Once caregivers complete certification, all expenses are paid for disaster responses.

The training is an overnight experience, simulating a shelter situation. It includes an overview of the work; understanding phases of disaster and how caregivers fit in; working with disaster partners, children, and family needs following disaster; supporting resilience in children; setting up a children's center with a Kit of Comfort; ethical guidelines; and the certification process.
