

Continuing Education Opportunities for the Mid-Atlantic District

Fall Ventures Courses to Focus on Trauma Informed Care

The October and November course offerings from the "Ventures in Christian Discipleship" program at McPherson (Kan.) College will be a two-part series focusing on Trauma Informed Care. (Part 1 not required to take Part 2)

Part 1 of the series, "Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)", will be held Saturday, October 13 online at 9 a.m. – 12 p.m. CST. The science of the past 30 years is painting a clear picture—when kids are exposed to overwhelming, unsupported adversity (abuse, neglect, domestic violence, etc.) there is profound effect for them and for all of us. This class will introduce the ACE findings, briefly discuss the neurobiology of stress and propose simple solutions that promote hope and healing. There will also be time at the end of the presentation for a dialogue regarding the implications for Ventures participants.

Part 2 of the series, "Trauma Informed Care (TIC)", will be held Saturday, November 17 online at 9 a.m. – 12 p.m. CST. We will briefly review and highlight the ACEs findings and dig deeper into the core concepts of TIC. We will focus specifically on the core concepts of regulation, relationship and reason to be as critical components of a connected and healthy world. We will also discuss how response to overwhelming adversity and trauma tends to create dysregulation, relational skepticism and pursuit of purpose that is often superficial and absent of meaning. The strategies discussed that create regulation, relationship and reason to be are also relevant for managing conflict and other relevant challenges of modern life.

Both classes will be taught by Tim Grove, chief clinical officer at SaintA, Milwaukee, Wis., and serves as the senior leader responsible for the trauma informed care initiatives across all agency programs. He was responsible for the implementation of SaintA's trauma informed care philosophy and practices., is a Mentor with the Child Trauma Academy, and is a Master Trainer in Dr. Rob Anda and Laura Porter's ACE Interface curriculum. Tim and the training team at SaintA have trained more than 50,000 people from diverse disciplines over the past 10 years.

Course Description and Objectives

This course provides a brief overview of the history of Christianity from the Reformation to World War II. Topics of study include the Magisterial Reformation, the Radical Reformation, Roman Catholic reform, Protestant Orthodoxy, Pietism and the Evangelical Awakening, the impact of Enlightenment rationalism, missionary expansion, Protestant liberalism and fundamentalism, the ecumenical movement, and Christianity in developing countries.

Students will:

- attempt to understand key Christian thinkers and their ideas in relationship to Christian ritual and practice as well as to non-Christian religions, philosophy, and natural science,
- 2. familiarize themselves with some of the major issues, events, and personalities in Christian history,
- 3. become aware of the problems and methods of the academic disciplines of church history, intellectual history, and theology.

Instructor: Ken Rogers

Dr. Ken Rogers is Professor of Historical Studies at Bethany Theological Seminary in Indiana. A graduate of Manchester University in Indiana, Oxford University in England, and Harvard University in Massachusetts, he has pursued study and research at Marburg University in Germany as well. After three decades teaching in the Religion and Philosophy Department of Manchester University, he joined the Bethany faculty in 2008. He taught a seminar for Marburg University in the fall semester 2017. He has been an ordained minister in the Church of the Brethren for more than thirty years.

Clergy Tax Seminar January 19, 2019

Featuring in-depth information on changes to 2018 tax returns resulting from the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act

Students, pastors, and other church leaders are invited to attend either in person at Bethany Theological Seminary or online.

- Learn how to file clergy taxes correctly and legally.
- Comply with regulations while maximizing tax deductions.
- Earn 0.4 CEUs requires live or online attendance in the first two sessions.

In a new format this year, the annual Clergy Tax Seminar will be broken into three sessions: Clergy Tax Law; the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act, covering significant changes for 2018 tax returns; and how to use TurboTax to prepare a clergy tax return. As always, the workshop will describe the rules regarding clergy tax returns, updates on important court cases, and practice preparing a clergy tax return. In addition, the many changes affecting individuals under the 2017 Tax Cuts and Jobs Act will be covered in depth in a separate session. Credit for 0.4 CEUs will be available for attending the morning and early afternoon sessions.

This seminar is highly recommended for all pastors and other church leaders who wish to understand clergy taxes, including treasurers, steward commission chairs, and church board chairs.

Deb Oskin has been doing clergy tax returns since 1989, when her husband left seminary to pastor a small rural Church of the Brethren congregation. As a pastor's wife and later as a tax professional, she learned the tax problems and pitfalls associated with the IRS's identification of clergy as "hybrid employees." In 2011, after twelve years with H&R Block, Deb left to start her own tax practice, specializing in clergy taxes. Clergy clients now make up 75 percent of her client base.

Deb was ordained in 2004 when she was called by the Living Peace Church of the Brethren in Columbus, Ohio, to be their peace minister to the wider community. She served as Southern Ohio District's board chair from 2007-11 and is currently serving as Southern Ohio-Kentucky 2018 District Moderator. She was elected to the Pastoral Compensation & Benefits Advisory Committee at Annual Conference 2018 and is super excited about it!

She's been teaching and presenting nationally on clergy taxation to clergy, treasurers and administrators, and tax pros since 2004. Other than the fact that she really likes to talk, Deb does this because of her deep belief that clergy can devote more of their energy to ministry if they aren't stressed by tax debt.

The Bible through Visual Art

Monday, April 1, 2019 - Elizabethtown College - Susquehanna Room 9 a.m. - 4 p.m. (Registration begins at 8:30 a.m.)

Presenters: Chris Bucher and Bob Neff

Chris is the Carl W. Zeigler Professor of Religion at Elizabethtown College, where she teaches courses in biblical study.

Bob is an Old Testament scholar, President Emeritus of Juniata College, and former General Secretary of the Church of the Brethren.

The primary goal of this class is to explore the intersection of art and biblical texts by examining the ways in which the visual arts (e.g., paintings, drawings, mosaics, sculpture) offer new insights into biblical texts. How can visual art call our attention to neglected biblical texts or to overlooked elements in texts? How can it help us see the multiple levels of meaning within a text? How can visual art help us wrestle with difficult biblical texts or with challenging theological concepts? We will explore early Christian art, which visualized Jesus as shepherd and highlighted the biblical stories about Daniel, Jonah, and Noah, and we will examine biblical interpretation by selected artists from the Renaissance to the 21st century. Finally, we will discuss ways in which art might be incorporated into church life as a way of engaging church members at visual and kinesthetic levels. Format of the course: presentations by Chris Bucher and Bob Neff and guided group discussions. Those who register for the course will receive a bibliography of recommended resources.
