New Ventures in Christian Discipleship season to begin September 28

The Ventures in Christian Discipleship program at McPherson (Kan.) College is moving into its eighth year of providing useful, affordable education to small church congregations. The first two online courses of the year will focus on Creation Care. All classes are donation-based and continuing education credit is available for \$10 per course.

On September 28 at 9 a.m. -12 p.m. CST, Kirk MacGregor will present the course "God's Relation to the Natural World and Creation Care." Many philosophers and theologians view God's relation to the natural world as parallel to the relation between our souls and our bodies. This course will examine this notion and explore its implications for creation care. Putting this notion in conversation with Jesus' parable of the sheep and the goats (Matthew 25:31-46), this course will argue that what we do, positively or negatively, to the natural world, we do to Jesus himself.

Dr. Kirk MacGregor is Assistant Professor of Philosophy and Religion and Department Chair at McPherson College. He is the author of five books, the most recent of which is *Contemporary Theology: An Introduction* (2019). Kirk is a member of the McPherson Church of the Brethren.

On October 26 9 a.m. -12 p.m. CST, Sharon Yohn will present the course "Faith Through Action: Effective approaches to solving the climate challenge." God calls on us to act when our brothers and sisters are in need. The destabilization of our climate is already causing immense human suffering, leaving us with a clear call to action. But how? When faced with a problem this large and complicated, it is hard to feel like our actions are meaningful. In this course we will explore three types of meaningful action you can take and the resources available to support those actions.

Dr. Sharon Yohn is an active member of the Stone Church of the Brethren in central Pennsylvania, as well as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Chemistry and Biochemistry at Juniata College. She earned her B.S. in Environmental Science at Juniata College, and a Ph.D. in Environmental Geosciences from Michigan State University. Called to action by both her scientific understanding and her faith, Sharon has been acting as an advocate for climate action for several years. Sharon co-wrote a series of articles on faith and climate change for the Church of the Brethren magazine, The Messenger, and served on a denominational Creation Care Committee. She is the group leader for the Juniata Chapter of Citizens' Climate Lobby, a non-partisan organization building political will for a livable future.



Dale Leverknight currently serves as pastor of the Montgomery Church of the Brethren in Western PA. He draws on years of experience in pastoral care, counseling, and emergency services. He has a BS degree in Biblical Studies/Theology and an MA in Christian Counseling, both from Eastern Mennonite University.

Pastoral Care and Crisis Intervention is a series of four sessions (March 30 and October 26, 2019, and two TBA in 2020), which will provide the most basic skills pastors need to begin to offer spiritual support and comfort to persons in our care. The sessions will benefit deacons and other lay leaders, in addition to pastors. While the sessions build upon one another, you will gain valuable information even if you can attend only one session. Science Fiction and Theology: Connections with Culture

Presenter: Steven Schweitzer

Steve Schweitzer (PhD, Notre Dame) is Academic Dean and Professor at Bethany Theological Seminary. He regularly teaches a graduate seminar on Chronicles-Ezra-Nehemiah and a course on Science Fiction and Theology. Steve has preached, taught, and led workshops for several congregations and districts. Steve and his wife, Jill, have 3 children. They attend Cedar Grove Church of the Brethren in the Southern Ohio/Kentucky District.

Science Fiction is extremely popular in our wider culture. This genre is filled with theological themes: who is God, what does it mean to be human, what is the nature of evil, how is it overcome, is war or violence necessary, to name only a few. Based on a course Steve teaches at Bethany Seminary, examples from widely popular SciFi series – Star Wars, Star Trek, and Doctor Who – that allow connections between theology and culture - will be explored.

Course Description and Objectives

This course represents an educational partnership with Pastor Bruce Deel and City of Refuge Ministries©, along with Discipleship Ministries of the Church of the Brethren. This course will also explore the ministries of other faith-based groups in metro Atlanta that will expose students to a variety of styles and strategies for addressing the complex issues of ministry in large urban contexts. This will be an immersive urban experience with a focus on the ministries of care in Atlanta dedicated to the goals Jesus outlined in Matthew 25.

Students will also be introduced to the networking approach to capacity building that is necessary for partnerships that minister with marginalized communities in the city. This will involve an exploration of the "collective impact" that results when leaders from the three main sectors--non-profit, public and government advocate for the voiceless through collaborative efforts.

- Think critically about the complexities of ministry with marginalized communities in an urban context.
- · *Identify* the major challenges of ministry with marginalized populations in an urban context.
- Define the core theological concepts that inform ministry in an urban context in a manner that reflects an understanding of ministry that is inspirational, incarnational and improvisational.

Instructor: Joshua Brockway

Joshua Brockway is the director of spiritual formation and cocoordinator for Discipleship Ministries of the Church of the Brethren. He holds a PhD in Church History from The Catholic University of America and has served in ministry in Indiana and the city of Atlanta.

This course will be held in conjunction with a graduate level course taught by Bethany's Assistant Professor of Ministry Formation, Dan Poole.

Housing will be in dormitory-style accommodations provided on the campus of City of Refuge.

Students will travel to Atlanta on January 6, 2020. Class sessions are planned for January 7 through January 15. Students can plan to arrange for return travel on either the evening of January 15 or on January 16.
