





How To Care For Your Quilt

Please realize that quilts should not be stored in plastic bags. It is recommended that they be stored either in a large pillowcase, a sheet, or with tissue paper. New quilts may be washed with care if necessary, but be aware that some dark colors may bleed. Machine wash in cold water, with mild soap and on delicate cycle. Either line dry or use your dryer on air fluff only. Do not use heat settings on the dryer.

QCDs can also be counted toward your Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) for the year if:

- Your age is 70 ½ or older,
- the amount of the QCD does not exceed what would be taxed as ordinary income, which excludes non-deductible contributions.
- the sum of all annual QCDs does not exceed \$100,000, AND
- the RMD deadline for the current year is met (generally December 31).

If a Qualified Charitable Distribution sounds like a favorable move for you, we invite you to prayerfully consider the Church of the Brethren as one of your charitable organizations of choice. 





Our Mission

Through preaching, teaching, and worshipping, we are a church seeking, reflecting, and projecting the light of Jesus Christ in our community, our city, and our world.



Dear Sisters and Brothers of the Mid-Atlantic District,

War and violence from Ukraine to Africa to a U.S. school shooting challenged BDM to respond creatively and prayerfully to deep hardships and loss during 2022. Whether responding to a natural disaster, violence, or other crisis, BDM staff and volunteers journeyed with survivors and families toward recovery and hope, often transforming lives, in places like Waverly, Tenn.; Uvalde, Texas; Dawson Springs, Ky; and North Fort Meyers, Fla.

Encouragement for this ministry is found throughout the sacred scripture, such as Galatians 6:9a, 10a: "Let us not lose heart in doing good, . . . while we have opportunity, let us do good to all people". It is also found in our partners such as Pamlico County (N.C.) Disaster Recovery Coalition, who shared: "[Not] only have you (BDM) helped to repair hurricane damaged homes, but you have also helped to restore and mend broken hearts. The light you have shown, and the relationships you have built with survivors and their families, will long have an impact on them and their generations."

Children's Disaster Services (CDS) volunteers responded this past year with deep compassion to the school shooting in Uvalde (Texas), floods, wildfires, and hurricanes. In Uvalde, specially trained volunteers (Critical Response Childcare teams) supported children and families of the 19 children killed by a lone shooter. These volunteers had 385 contacts with children as they helped them process the trauma and build resiliency in the face of this tragedy.

After Hurricane Ian made landfall in late September, causing catastrophic damage along southwest Florida, CDS volunteers were initially housed by rebuilding volunteers with homes in the area. CDS teams served for six weeks in Florida shelters, with over 400 child contacts. During 2022, a total of 86 CDS volunteers served 1,065 children on eight responses. CDS also held three volunteer training workshops resulting in 40 newly trained volunteers, bringing the total CDS volunteer base to 576 by year's end.

In March 2022, the BDM rebuilding program network of volunteers finished four years of repairing and rebuilding homes in the Carolinas following Hurricanes Matthew (2016) and Florence (2018). The program transitioned to Waverly, Tenn., for the remainder of the year, in response to devastating August 2021 flooding, when over 17 inches of rain fell in 24 hours. In October, a three week short-term response supported new home construction in Dawson Springs, Ky., where tornadoes destroyed around 650 homes in December 2021. Volunteer leadership on the projects was provided by 47 disaster project leaders from across the country who served to welcome and support 572 volunteers. The rebuilding program site moved to Dawson Springs, Ky., in January 2023 to continue the tornado recovery with local partners.

A local hybrid response to the October 2021 tidal flooding in Maryland's Somerset and Dorchester counties was led by members of the Mid-Atlantic District, with support from BDM staff, vehicles, and equipment. In 2022, two homes were repaired by 35 volunteers through a grant award from

Box 188, New Windsor, Maryland 21776-0188 410-635-8731 800-451-4407 Fax: 410-635-8739 Lowes Home Improvement and the National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (NVOAD). This funding included \$30,000 in Lowes Gift Cards to purchase construction materials for the homes and \$4,200 to support volunteer housing and meals. This work will be completed in 2023.

Early in 2022, the world watched as Russia invaded Ukraine, causing a war that has displaced more than 12 million Ukrainians, with reports of nearly 7,000 deaths at the end of 2022. BDM responded with Emergency Disaster Fund (EDF) grants totaling \$215,000 in collaboration with five key partners, the most significant being Church World Service and International Orthodox Christian Charities. Additional grants are expected early in 2023.

The BDM global response includes dual programs in Haiti that continue the 2021 earthquake response, with \$166,969 in funds, while also addressing the acute overlapping crisis caused by the total collapse of the Haitian government. With severe hunger on the rise, a special program is helping to provide food to vulnerable families in the communities around the Haitian Brethren churches through a \$39,000 grant. Smaller EDF grants supported global Churches of the Brethren in Uganda (\$27,500) and Venezuela (\$10,000) with flood recovery programs, as well as the South Sudan Mission (\$11,000).

The Nigeria Crisis Response, a continued response to terrorism since 2014, provided support to four camps for internally displaced persons (IDPs), food distributions, medical assistance, livelihood training centers for widows and orphans, seeds and fertilizer, new wells for drinking water, and home repairs for the most vulnerable. Additional EDF grants included support for vulnerable Syrian refugees and Lebanese in Lebanon, continued hurricane and flood recovery in Honduras, and support for programming of the Rwandan Church of the Brethren.

The total BDM programmatic expenses in 2022 were \$1,676,048. This includes the expenses from EDF allocations that support specific programs such as \$274,393 for U.S. responses (Rebuilding, CDS, etc.); \$190,076 for the Nigeria Crisis Response; \$281,469 for other Global CoB partners; and \$364,909 for all other global responses.

The Mid-Atlantic District Disaster Response Auction, and your tireless and faithful support, provided for these responses and BDM's continued service this year. This ministry is only possible because the whole church is working together. Individual members and supporters, volunteers, churches, districts, and the auctions are part of the body of Christ coming together to pray, serve, give hope, and help families heal. Through all this we pray that more people come to God and know God's amazing love.

Thank you for your support. You are an integral part of the body bearing witness to God's love for all who are lost and need Christ.



Whether you buy a quilt or a box lot we need you to come eat, bid and enjoy what the day may bring. Please think about becoming a volunteer on the committee or on a disaster site...we all need you.



District Disaster Coordinator's Corner

Galatians 5:13 "...serve one another in love"

Thanks to all the volunteers who have given of their time and talents supporting Brethren Disaster Ministries (BDM) over the years at many sites around the country! Your willingness to help with child care, rebuild homes, provide household support, cook meals, or help support BDM and its volunteers through your prayers, encouragement, donations, auction purchases, or by any other means, have made a tremendous difference to those whose lives have been impacted by natural and man-made disasters.

This past year presented a special opportunity to volunteer within the Mid-Atlantic District on the Eastern Shore of Maryland. Abnormally high tides during a storm in October 2021, flooded numerous homes in Dorchester and Somerset Counties. BDM applied for and received a National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD) and Lowe's grant to repair 3 homes in Dorchester and Somerset Counties. The grant included \$30,000 in gift cards to purchase construction materials at Lowe's for making repairs to the homes, and cash funds to support volunteers performing the work. A special thanks to those who volunteered, many over several weeks, to repair the homes and enable owners to return to their homes.

Brethren Disaster Ministries provides help to people in need of assistance to regain full use of their home after it has been damaged or destroyed by natural disasters. The program provides a helpful and safe environment for volunteers to assist in the repair or rebuilding of homes and to provide child care and hope to the homeowners. This is a great opportunity for people to use their talents and gifts, to teach others construction and household skills, to learn new skills, while enjoying the comradery of fellow volunteers and helping those who are hurting and in need. Volunteer housing is provided, often at local churches or community buildings, where weekly volunteers and leaders stay, eat and become more connected with the community. Volunteers DO NOT have to be Church of the Brethren members and DO NOT need to be skilled construction craft people. If you have a heart for service and Disaster Relief recovery or a desire for a new challenge, please contact us and we can acquaint you with what to expect during a volunteer week and get you started toward a very rewarding experience.

Mid-Atlantic District Responds in Partnership with BDM

In October 2021, tidal flooding along the Chesapeake Bay inundated streets, homes, and businesses in Maryland's Somerset and Dorchester counties. Although approximately 150 homes were flooded, this became a "low-attention disaster", meaning the news of the event and its impact did not make the mainstream national or state media. Recovery for survivors has been difficult. FEMA funding was not available because the damage was not enough to meet the threshold for a federal disaster declaration and state funding was also not available. The recovery has been supported primarily by the Eastern Shore Long Term Recovery Group and the Maryland Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (MDVOAD).

Both BDM and the Mid-Atlantic District (MAD) participate in MDVOAD, with the district often supporting local disaster responses by providing volunteers and leaders. The recent tidal flooding response presented an opportunity for BDM to partner with MAD on home repair. To leverage resources and funding to support the work, BDM staff applied for and received a grant from National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (NVOAD) and Lowes Home Improvement. The grant included \$30,000 in Lowes gift cards to cover the costs of construction

materials which the families were unable to purchase on their own and \$4,200 to cover some volunteer travel and housing costs.

MAD district disaster coordinator Jeff McKee recruited volunteers from various areas of the district who typically worked for four workdays during each trip. Those who traveled a distance were provided with overnight housing, while local volunteers traveled daily to the jobsites. Several volunteers from the Western and Southern Pennsylvania districts also joined the rebuilding effort. In total, 35 volunteers served during nine weeks to support three families with their recovery. Even though the grant is completed, the Mid-Atlantic District plans to coordinate future trips to serve in the area in 2023.

Reflecting on Hurricane Ian Deployment

Each Children's Disaster Services deployment is unique, and I continue to learn with each one. I haven't been at this very long and it's definitely out of my comfort zone. A very wise CDS friend reminded me, "If it's out of my comfort zone, what about the families we are helping?"

The key to Hurricane Ian deployment was flexibility. (Isn't it always?) Initially, our team was on day-to-day standby for a week, then told to stand down before being told we were going. By planes, Ubers, and rental vehicles, we all arrived in the Fort Myers area, eager to set up a childcare center.

Flexibility continued to be a theme when it came to where we would be able to stay. We first stayed with gracious people who opened their homes to us before moving into the Red Cross tent city at the county fairgrounds. We stayed in air-conditioned tents housing about 100 people, with bathroom and shower trailers outside. It was starting to feel a little bit like Girl Scouts and church mission trips, so I started to feel a little bit more in my comfort zone.

We set up at the Hertz Ice Arena. I had seen it on the news before deploying but seeing it and

feeling it was another experience. It had been over two weeks since Hurricane Ian and people were still living in the arena, most unsure of what or where to go next. The families were living on plywood set on top of the ice with their Red Cross cots and plastic bags full of clothes. Our living facilities were quite luxurious in comparison. It took a bit more of that flexibility to find a suitable, safe place to set up "work" at the Arena, but we ended up with a wonderful private area to make sure the children were able

Unfortunately, the Hertz Arena closed rather abruptly leaving us little chance to say goodbye to our "regulars" and not knowing where we were going next. Flexibility. The families relocated to another center, and after some searching, we found that the new center had already dedicated a large space for CDS, which we were able to set up for the team that followed us.

to enjoy their time.

It's difficult to leave a deployment knowing the families we help are still experiencing hard circumstances, but we do our little part. The many smiles of the children, parents, and other volunteers are the reward. As with all CDS deployments I have been on, I have met the kindest, most amazing, and inspirational people on my teams. We meet as strangers, often at the airport, but leave as family.

Humanitarian Response to Multiple Crises in Haiti

In Haiti multiple crises (economic, political, gang violence, gender-based violence, kidnapping, natural disasters, a cholera outbreak, and very high inflation) have merged into a spiraling humanitarian tragedy that has put the country "on the verge of an abyss", according to United Nations human rights chief Volker Türk. Haiti is the lowest per capita income country in the western hemisphere and is also prone to natural disasters. Already at high risk of food insecurity, poor nutrition, and poverty, more than half of the 4.7 million people living in Haiti now face a humanitarian disaster, human rights violations, and a hunger crisis. In many parts of the country it is unsafe to travel or leave homes. Heads of household are limited in their ability to work or even go to the market to purchase food.

Haiti was already unstable, with a mostly failed government fraught with corruption and empty congressional offices (elections had not been held), when Haitian President Jovenel Moïse was killed in July 2021. At that time, gangs that were mostly tied to corrupt former political figures already controlled much of the country's capitol city, Port-au-Prince. The president's death seemed to encourage these gangs to expand their terror and violence, often using kidnapping to fund their operations. There were 1,107 documented kidnappings between January and October 2022. The gangs also use brutal violence, rape, and terror to control the people.

In August 2021, an earthquake struck southern

Haiti, killing 2,201 people and adding to the growing crisis in Haiti. As has been reported over the last 18 months, Emergency Disaster Fund (EDF) grants are supporting a joint BDM/Eglises des Freres d' Haiti (Haiti Church of the Brethren) response in Saut Mathurine to rebuild homes destroyed in the tremor.

The armed gangs escalated their violence in 2022, gaining control of the oil depot, some ports where supplies are delivered, and some of the public offices. The acting prime minister ended fuel subsidies in September, adding to the rapidly rising cost of food and supplies for desperately poor Haitian families. In October, a new cholera outbreak added to the misery of the people.

Haiti CoB general secretary Romy Telfort remarks that "Haiti's political problems put everyone living in the country in great difficulty. In every area of the country, there are at least two groups of gangs kidnapping people, killing people, demonstrations all day, all roads blocked, cars can't circulate, no gas, no schools, no roads, no food, there is no water for people to drink, life is becoming more threatened every day." (*This was translated from Haitian Creole.*)

Leaders of the Haitian Church and BDM staff worked together on a planned intervention for families left hungry by this growing crisis. Traditional interventions are not possible or safe because of gang violence and the likelihood of having food supplies stolen at gunpoint. Many

other relief organizations have left Haiti or limited their activities because of the violence and kidnappings.

Each of the 30 Haitian churches and preaching points have identified 20-40 of the most at-risk families in their community needing assistance, for a total of 800. Through a new approach, funds have been or will be transferred through apps or bank accounts to the local church leaders. When it is safe to do so, these leaders will purchase rice, dried beans, and cooking oil at local markets to be distributed to the families in their area at a secure place and time. National church leaders are monitoring the funds transfers and food distributions to ensure quality and consistency of programming.

These food distributions will not solve Haiti's many problems, but they will feed hungry people and remind them that others care about them and that God loves them.

A New Home for Survivors and BDM Volunteers

In Dawson Springs, Ky., Habitat for Humanity of the Pennyrile Region (Habitat) and the Hopkins County Long-Term Recovery Group are providing new homes to survivors of the December 2021 tornadoes which devastated Western Kentucky. These new builds are needed to bring most residents back into the community because over 650 homes were totally destroyed in this small town. Building new homes in this area is an additional program for Habitat, alongside their usual non-disaster related programs that help "families build and improve places to call home".

Habitat is also providing a home for BDM volunteers and leaders at their facility in nearby Madisonville, Ky., enabling the BDM Rebuilding Program to set up in the area and support this disaster recovery. Through the work of BDM leaders and a move team from the Southern Ohio/ Kentucky District, several additional rooms were built in a portion of Habitat's warehouse, with a loft area above the rooms to provide housing and a safe gathering space for meals and meetings. The Habitat executive director even gave up his office as a space for leadership to sleep and is sharing office space with other staff. The rest of the BDM leadership is housed in four travel trailers in the parking lot behind the warehouse. These trailers were part of a recent donation through Good360, with one given to BDM and the other three to Habitat.

Finding a housing location in communities impacted by disasters is often a challenge and is sometimes the biggest barrier for volunteer groups like BDM to be able to help long-term. BDM and local leaders had explored two other options for housing at churches in the area. In the end, the churches were not open to hosting BDM for the

extended period of time it hoped to stay in the community. With seemingly no other options available in December 2022, and with BDM scheduled to arrive in January 2023, Habitat offered their space for housing because they were so anxious to have BDM volunteers to come to help with their work.

BDM worked on some stage of 10 new homes in Dawson Springs in the first month that volunteers served in 2023. BDM volunteers had already helped complete two homes in the area during a short-term response in October 2022. Volunteers are currently scheduled to serve for six months in Dawson Springs, with the hope of continuing work through at least the end of 2023.



Driving Directions to the Auction



From the North:

(directions given from Hanover, PA to the Ag Center) Take Rt. 94 South (becomes MD Rt. 30 at the state line). Follow 30 to Manchester and turn right on Rt. 27. Follow Rt. 27 to Rt. 140 East (in Westminster). Turn left onto the ramp to 140 East and travel to the first traffic light. Turn right onto Center Street. Take Center Street through two traffic lights to Gist Road. Turn right on Gist Road and follow signs to new entrance. Turn right onto Ag Center drive.

From the South:

Take Interstate 270 North to Rt. 27. Follow Rt. 27 to Kate Wagner Road. (Kate Wagner Road intersects Rt. 27 before you reach the city of Westminster.) Make a right onto Kate Wagner Road (which intersects Rt. 27 at a traffic light) and follow approximately 1.2 miles. Turn left onto Gist Road. Continue on Gist Road until you reach Smith Ave at stop sign. Continue on Gist Road about 1/2 block and make left at Ag Center entrance,

From the East:

From Baltimore Beltway 695, take Interstate 795 north toward Westminster. Follow the signs onto MD 140 and take 140 into Westminster. Turn left onto Center Street. Take Center Street through two traffic lights to Gist Road. Turn right on Gist Road and follow signs to new entrance. turn right onto Ag Center drive.

From the West:

Take I-70 East to the Mt. Airy/Route 27 Exit. Head North on Rt. 27 toward Westminster for approximately 15 miles. Make a right onto Kate Wagner Road (which intersects Rt. 27 at a traffic light) and follow approximately 1.2 miles. Turn left onto Gist Road. Continue on Gist Road until you reach Smith Ave at stop sign. Continue on Gist Road about 1/2 block and make left at Ag Center entrance.
