

Engaging the Query

The Mid-Atlantic District received a query from the Arlington congregation that was distributed at the 2023 Mid-Atlantic District Conference and will be included in the business for the 2024 District Conference. A "query" is a congregation's way of asking a question to the broader denomination. Should the 2024 District Conference pass the query, it would be received by Standing Committee as a possible item of business for the 2025 Annual Conference. Standing Committee reviews and recommends action for all such received business prior to Annual Conference.

THE QUERY repeats Standing Committee's assertion that LGBTQ+ people experience discrimination even in Brethren contexts, including "violence, bullying, and a general sense of dismissal." It wonders if changes to denominational statements would help minimize risks of future harm.

AS A DISTRICT, we are seeking to engage and understand the query prior to discerning and voting on it at District Conference in October of 2024. Regional and online engagement sessions will be held to provide information, answer questions, and share in meaningful dialogue.

At these sessions, we will **not be deciding** whether to advance the Query to Annual Conference; that vote will take place at the 2024 Mid-Atlantic District Conference. Rather, we hope to find a **better understanding** of the Query and the motivations behind it. Participants are invited to engage the query, turning away an "us-versus-them" model. We hope all participants can **share**, **listen**, **seek to understand**, **and learn** from the convictions of others.

"Therefore... be it resolved: that we commit ourselves to forbearance which recognizes and respects differences of opinion and differing degrees of spiritual insight. We will show deference in disputable matters (Romans 14:1) while practicing prayerful study and conversation in core beliefs." — Excepted from the 2008 Church of the Brethren Resolution: Urging Forbearance

The Query: What You Should Know

The full Query is being shared with each congregation in the District, along with an accompanying letter from the Arlington Church of the Brethren. Digital copies may also be requested from the District office. You are encouraged to read both the Query and the accompanying letter in-full. Below are some highlights from the Query and the letter.

What the Query does not ask:

- The Query does not seek to provide clear answers on where the Church of the Brethren stands on human sexuality.
- The Query does not ask congregations or individuals to change current practices or deeply-held convictions.
- The Query does not seek an open and affirming stance for the denomination.

What the Query does ask:

- The Query does seek to respect the spiritual integrity and credentialing of both LGBTQ+ affirming ministers and congregations, as well as ministers and congregations who understand such affirmations as inconsistent with their deeply held convictions.
- The Query does ask congregations to continue living in fellowship with other congregations even when beliefs and practices differ among us, finding a path forward for all to live peacefully as members of the Church of the Brethren.
- The Query does ask us to prayerfully consider how we might encourage pastoral approaches that reduce the risks of harm toward LGBTQ+ siblings in faith.

Some reasons for the Query, according to Arlington:

- The church has largely failed to honor positive encouragements in the 1983 paper on Human Sexuality, such as calls to reduce the discrimination of and advocate for the legal rights of LGBTQ+ people.
- Several suggestions and language used have become out-of-date in the 40+ years since its passing.
- Brethren believe that theological unity cannot be created by human forces; "conformity is humanity's pattern." (Statement on Biblical Authority, 1979)
- Brethren have always believed in 'no force in religion' and have valued the prayerful discernment of the local community in matters of faith and practice.
- Standing Committee led Annual Conference in a time of silent confession in 2023, stating that expressions of theological differences too often cause pain toward one another and specifically toward our LGBTQ+ siblings.
- The time of confession was named as a "first step."
 Arlington wonders: What's the next step?

February Ventures Course to Focus on Creative Church

The February online offering from the Ventures in Christian Discipleship program at McPherson College will be "Divine Creativity and Holy Imagination: Cultivating a Creative Church" to be presented by Rev. Liz Ullery Swenson. The course will be held online in two Tuesday evening sessions, February 13 and 20, both at 7:30-9:00 p.m. Central Time.

Before we know anything else about God, we know of God's creativity. God created day and night, water and land, fish and birds, calling them good. God created humanity in God's own creative image, and in doing so, imbued us with the capacity for creativity and imagination.

How are our faith communities fostering that sacred creativity and holy imagination? How do we create opportunities for open-ended exploration, integrated artistic reflection and a spiritual practice that is tactile? Theologian Sallie McFague invites us to marvel in the wonder of the Divine presence in all things, "We might begin to recognize the extraordinariness of the ordinary. We would begin to delight in creation, not as the work of an eternal deity, but as a sacrament of the living God." Through God's holy and creative imagination, all of creation is alive with the ever-creating breath of God, and we are invited to be co-creators.

In our time together we will explore the possibilities for cultivating space for creativity and imagination in our daily lives and on Sunday morning. How might our prayers change if we prayed with finger paint or sidewalk chalk? What if we worshiped God with our hands in rich soil? Have we created spaces to encounter a colorful God?

Created in the image of the Divine Creator, every person contains the capacity for creativity and imagination, whether you are an experienced artist, social media content creator, gifted quilter, or haven't doodled since elementary school. This is an opportunity to expand our idea of what it means to be a creative person.

Liz Ullery Swenson lives at the intersection of spirituality and creativity. As the planting-pastor with WildWood Gathering she is cultivating and reimagining faith community. Starting in 2016 WildWood is creating safe spiritual space for those on the margins. She has a Bachelor in Theater Arts, a Masters of Library Science and Masters of Divinity. She is an overly ambitious gardener and mama to her five-year-old daughter, and she spends too much time on social media.

Continuing education credit is available for \$10 per course. During the registration process, you will have the opportunity to pay for CEUs and give an optional donation to the Ventures program.

Annual Conference provides an opportunity for the body of Christ known as the Church of the Brethren to come together to hear the voice of God as revealed by the Holy Spirit within and among us. Please join us for inspiring worship, informational Bible studies, communal discernment, engaging breakout sessions, energizing exhibits, empowering witness, nurturing fellowship and meaningful connection.

Registration Fees

Registration for both delegates and non-delegates for the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference will open at 12:00 Noon Central Time on **Friday, March 1, 2024.**

- The advance delegate registration fee is \$330 per delegate. Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for registering delegates onsite in Grand Rapids will be \$405. Don't wait!
- The advance non-delegate registration fee is \$150. Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for registering non-delegates onsite in Grand Rapids will be \$185.
- Registering as a Virtual Non-Delegate to watch business online, view special events and concerts, and
 participate in a number of equipping sessions is again an option. The advance virtual non-delegate registration
 fee is \$195 through June 10. From June 11 until July 7, the registration fee will be \$225. New this year is an
 option for Groups and Institutions to participate virtually from a common location. For more information go to

Registering a Delegate

Congregations may register their delegates using online registration beginning Wednesday, March 1, 2024 at 12:00 Central Time. Payment options include paying by credit card or sending a check. Go to www.brethren.org/ac and click on the "Registration" button and then choose "Delegate Registration". Each delegate's complete name, address, email, and phone number are required. If you need assistance, call the Annual Conference Office (800-323-8039, ext 4366) and we will be happy to assist in registering online. Delegate registration fees provide each delegate with a Conference booklet, the business materials packet, a designated delegate name tag, and seating at the delegate tables at Annual Conference. Each congregation who registers a delegate or delegates will also receive a copy of the 2024 Annual Conference minutes.

Delegate Eligibility and Allotment

Delegates must be full members of the Church of the Brethren. The number of delegates for each congregation is based on the membership statistics as reported in the 2023 Church of the Brethren Yearbook:

This quote from Jesus' story about the last judgment is a reminder that we render service to God even as we respond to human need. The spirit of generous sharing, and the hunger that exists in many parts of the world come together in our Meat Canning project.

For the **46th** year, the Mid-Atlantic and SO PA Districts are cosponsoring a Meat Canning project which previously has enjoyed a generous response and enthusiastic support. The project is scheduled for April 1 - 4, 2024 at the Christian Aid Ministries facility.

The 2024 Meat Canning goal is to can approximately 17,000 pounds of chicken in 4 days of processing.



Starting funds are good, but we need to raise money if we intend to meet our goal. Excess money is held for next year's event. Expenses include the cost of the chicken, use of CAM's facility, labels, boxes, miscellaneous supplies, as well as shipping costs, when applicable. Congregations are encouraged to take offerings during January, February, March and April for this ministry of sharing and to forward these funds to their respective District Office.

The Meat Canning Project is a great way for us to minister to those in need during these difficult economic and disaster ridden times.

As in the past, a portion of the meat from this project will be provided to both Districts to be shared with local food banks and meal programs. The Meat Canning Committee has decided to wait until Spring 2024 to determine how a donation of meat or funds will be made to denominational ministries.

In order for the committee to provide adequate help for each shift, it is important that you inform your District Office ASAP when you will be available to volunteer.
