Re: Registration for the 2024 Church of the Brethren Annual Conference, Grand Rapids, Michigan -- July 3 - 7

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Annual Conference provides an opportunity for the body of Christ known as the Church of the Brethren to come together to hear the voice of God as revealed by the Holy Spirit within and among us. Please join us for inspiring worship, informational Bible studies, communal discernment, engaging breakout sessions, energizing exhibits, empowering witness, nurturing fellowship and meaningful connection.

#### **Registration Fees**

Registration for both delegates and non-delegates for the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference will open at 12:00 Noon Central Time on Friday, March 1, 2024.

- The advance delegate registration fee is \$330 per delegate. Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for registering delegates onsite in Grand Rapids will be \$405. Don't wait!
- The advance non-delegate registration fee is \$150. Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for registering non-delegates onsite in Grand Rapids will be \$185.
- Registering as a Virtual Non-Delegate to watch business online, view special events and concerts, and participate in a number of equipping sessions is again an option. The advance virtual non-delegate registration fee is \$195 through June 10. From June 11 until July 7, the registration fee will be \$225. New this year is an option for Groups and Institutions to participate virtually from a common location. For more information go to www.brethren.org/ac2024/registration and select Virtual.

#### **Registering a Delegate**

Congregations may register their delegates using online registration beginning Wednesday, March 1, 2024 at 12:00 Central Time. Payment options include paying by credit card or sending a check. Go to www.brethren.org/ac and click on the "Registration" button and then choose "Delegate Registration". Each delegate's complete name, address, email, and phone number are required. If you need assistance, call the Annual Conference Office (800-323-8039, ext 4366) and we will be happy to assist in registering online. Delegate registration fees provide each delegate with a Conference booklet, the business materials packet, a designated delegate name tag, and seating at the delegate tables at Annual Conference. Each congregation who registers a delegate or delegates will also receive a copy of the 2024 Annual Conference minutes.

#### **Delegate Eligibility and Allotment**

Delegates must be full members of the Church of the Brethren. The number of delegates for each congregation is based on the membership statistics as reported in the 2023 Church of the Brethren Yearbook:

#### **Non-Delegate Registration**

Non-delegate registration opens Wednesday, March 1, 2024 at 12:00 Central Time. When registering anyone other than a delegate, click on the "Non-Delegate Registration" button.

#### **New Registration System**

The Church of the Brethren is rolling out a new registration system this year that looks different than what we have used in the past. For more information about how to use the new site go to www.brethren.org/ac2024 then click Registration and go to the Instructions for New Registration Site. These instructions will be available a week before registration opens.

#### **Conference Hotels**

There are two hotels in the conference block: the **Amway Grand Plaza** and **Courtyard Grand Rapids Downtown**. Our Annual Conference Room Rate at both hotels will be \$119 plus tax (15%), totaling \$136.90 per night. Go to www.brethren.org/ac2024/hotels for more information. **The link for hotel reservations will be on the last page of the registration site immediately after you register as well as in the confirmation email sent**. Everyone can reserve a room upon completing their registration. *Do not call the hotel to make a reservation! Annual Conference discounted room rates are only available for online registrations made through our provided link*.

All five worship services will be available free of charge to all registered and non-registered persons.

#### **New Attendee Orientation**

We encourage delegates or non-delegates who have never attended or have not recently attended Annual Conference to attend the New Attendee Orientation session in Grand Rapids at 3:30 p.m. on Wednesday afternoon July 3. The location will be listed in the conference booklet.

Quilt tops are assembled before conference. No blocks can be accepted at conference for this year's quilts. All blocks delivered at conference will be considered for next year's quilts and wall hangings.

#### PLEASE FOLLOW THESE INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR QUILT BLOCK

#### TYPE OF FABRIC

- Pre-shrunk cotton or cotton blend.
- If you use stabilizer, Please use only water soluble, very soft or easily removed backing.

Do not use: double knit, counted cross-stitch on canvas, liquid embroidery, padded blocks, or heat-applied designs or photos.

PLEASE: NO GLUE

#### PATTERN

- Use your own creativity to make your design.
- Important: Identify your block with your congregation's name, state, and/or district. This makes the quilts more valuable! (Second blocks from your congregation need not be identified.)

#### SIZE OF BLOCK

• <u>Outside border:</u> Not less than 8½ square AFTER it is worked.

• <u>Inside design:</u> Not more than 8" square with nothing in the seam allowance.

Cut the block to size AFTER it has been pieced, embroidered, or appliquéd.

> Accuracy is important. Blocks less than 8½ inches will not fit; larger designs will be obscured.
