

You may be wondering why you're getting an email about 2025 Camp Mardela staff already! The compensation scale for volunteers has been slightly adjusted to as follows:

- Weekend/Half-Week counselor or resource 10% off camp voucher
- Full Week counselor or resource 20% off camp voucher
- Camp Director (any length) 40% off camp voucher

Summer staff salaries will still be a minimum of \$400 per week, and part-time staff minimum will be \$12/week.

If you think you may be able to help out in any capacity with these programs, please let me know. Also let me know if you know for sure that you can't, so I can recruit staff and volunteers accordingly.
