Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Annual Conference provides an opportunity for the body of Christ known as the Church of the Brethren to come together to hear the voice of God as revealed by the Holy Spirit within and among us. Please join us for inspiring worship, informational Bible studies, communal discernment, engaging breakout sessions, energizing exhibits, empowering witness, nurturing fellowship and meaningful connection.

Registration Fees

Registration for both delegates and non-delegates for the Church of the Brethren Annual Conference will open at 12:00 Noon Central Time on **Wednesday, March 5, 2025.**

- The advance delegate registration fee is \$350 per delegate. Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for registering delegates onsite in Greensboro will be \$425. Don't wait!
- The advance non-delegate registration fee is \$175. Advance registration will close on June 10. The fee for registering non-delegates onsite in Greensboro will be \$210.
- Registering as a Virtual Non-Delegate to watch business online, participate in a number of Equipping Sessions
 and see the Rockingham Male Chorus concert Saturday night is again an option. The advance virtual nondelegate registration fee is \$195 through June 27. There is also an option for Groups and Institutions to
 participate virtually from a common location for \$500. For more information go to

Registering a Delegate

Congregations may register their delegates using online registration beginning Wednesday, March 5, 2025 at 12:00 Noon Central Time. Payment options include paying by credit card or sending a check. Go to www.brethren.org/ac and click on the "Registration" button and then choose "Delegate Registration". Each delegate's complete name, address, email, and phone number are required. If you need assistance, call the Annual Conference Office (847-429-4366) and we will be happy to answer your questions. Delegate registration fees provide each delegate with a Conference booklet, the business materials packet, a designated delegate name tag, and seating at the delegate tables at Annual Conference. Each congregation who registers a delegate or delegates will also receive a copy of the 2025 Annual Conference minutes.

Delegate Eligibility and Allotment

Delegates must be full members of the Church of the Brethren. The number of delegates for each congregation is based on the membership statistics as reported in the 2024 Church of the Brethren Yearbook:

Up to 200 Members1 delegate401-600 Members3 delegates201-400 Members2 delegates601-800 Members4 delegates

Non-Delegate Registration

Non-delegate registration opens Wednesday, March 5, 2025 at 12:00 Noon Central Time. When registering anyone other than a delegate, click on the "Non-Delegate Registration" button.

2025 Silent Auction Publicity

The Program and Arrangements Committee is once again holding a silent auction at Annual Conference in Greensboro this summer. The idea initially emerged a few years ago during a discussion about how we could intentionally contribute to the vitality of and increase traffic in the exhibit area. However, it also offers us an opportunity to raise some additional funds. Proceeds for this year's auction will support the ministry of Annual Conference, particularly our ongoing efforts to break down barriers to full participation.

You can help!

Contribute an item to the auction. We are requesting donations of items to be included in the auction. Potential items fall in three categories:

- Arts and Craft Items Included in this category are quality and unique hand-made items like woodworking, pottery, fabric art, paintings or drawings, stained glass, and so on.
- Gift Baskets Baskets could be assembled around a theme (perhaps a retreat or family game night), organizational "swag", books (perhaps a recommended reading list), regional products, food, and so on. Be creative.
- Experiences Included in this category are things like tickets to events, use of vacation homes, trips, classes, a living room concert, and so on.
- Items being donated must be registered in advance. NO UNREGISTERED ITEMS WILL BE ACCEPTED ONSITE THIS YEAR. ONLINE SUBMISSIONS MUST BE RECEIVED BY JUNE

 1. Actual items must be onsite at Annual Conference no later than 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, July 2. Arrangements can be made to ship them to the Annual Conference office in advance if you are not planning to attend Annual Conference.

Volunteer to assist with the auction. We will need volunteers to staff the auction throughout Annual Conference. Volunteers will assist with receiving and staging auction items, registering bidders, and identifying/notifying winners. Visit the auction and bid—over and over again. Once onsite at Annual Conference, attendees are encouraged to visit the silent auction—located in Colony B just off the exhibit area—to bid on your favorite items (and browse through the exhibits while you are there). Make sure to return throughout the week to see if you have the winning bid or if you need to enter a higher bid. Bidding will open at 12:00 noon on Wednesday, July 2 and end at 2:00 p.m. Saturday, July 5. Winners will be announced by 4:30 p.m. that day and will have until 6:45 p.m. to return to the auction to pay for and pick up their items.






