Course Description:

Every church is a full-time church. No matter the size of the congregation, life for each member happens around the clock, every day of the week. Yet the reality is that many smaller congregations are unable to support a full-time minister. The tension between part-time hours and full-time demands can be challenging for multi-vocational or part-time pastors. Pastors serving in part-time contexts realize that their ministry is as full-bodied and challenging as a lead pastor in a multi-staffed church, yet often find themselves without guidance when forced to navigate the complexities of multiple demands on their time and emotional energy. This course will examine what it takes to have a vital and authentic ministry that is rooted in the multi-vocational reality.
